





CONNIE MORTIBOY CHOREOGRAPHER

ANDREW TIMMINS MUSICAL DIRECTOR

From an early age, Andy immersed himself in music, learning both piano and violin. His passion led him to study the subject at Southampton University before qualifying as a Music Teacher.

After several years in schools, he became Arts and Music Adviser in Warrington, a post he held for six years.

For the last ten years of his career, Andy worked in Sandwell, finishing as Assistant Director of Children and Schools before retiring in December 2022.

Alongside his professional work, Andy developed as a conductor. His first experience was with the Lincoln Gilbert and Sullivan Society, later moving to Lichfield where he directed the Operatic Society and District Pantomime.

He also conducted a variety of school productions, including Oliver, Grease, Guys and Dolls, South Pacific and West Side Story.

Since retiring, Andy has been able to devote more time to the stage.

After directing the music for Made in Dagenham with TMCS in 2021, he has gone on to lead productions of Chitty Chitty Bang Bang, Calamity Jane, and the demanding Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. He is now delighted to return as Musical Director for Grease.



THE MUSICAL SYNOPSIS

Act One

At Rydell High in 1959, the T-Birds and Pink Ladies return from summer break. Danny Zuko brags about a summer romance, while new student Sandy Dumbrowski confides in the Pink Ladies about her own summer romance, only to discover it was Danny. Their reunion is rocky as Danny acts "too cool" for his gang.

The teens navigate cliques, cars, and crushes: Kenickie shows off his new ride, Frenchy dreams of beauty school, and Rizzo picks on Sandy for being too wholesome. At a pajama party, Sandy is mocked but she declares her resilience.

Act Two


Excitement builds for the big school dance.
Vince Fontaine hosts, couples spar, and Danny disappoints Sandy with his behaviour. Frenchy is visited by an Angel, while Danny tries awkwardly to prove himself by joining sports. At the drive-in, Danny gives Sandy his ring but pushes too far, straining their romance.

Meanwhile, Rizzo faces unexpected challenges, showing a more vulnerable side. Eventually, Sandy decides to reinvent herself, she surprises Danny with her bold new look.

Reunited, they profess their love in and the whole gang celebrates.

GREASE - THE STAGE MUSICAL

- John Travolta, who was playing Doody on Broadway at the time, was
- cast as Danny Zuko after Henry Winkler declined the role.
 Olivia Newton-John nearly turned down the role of Sandy, believing she was too old, but accepted after a screen test.
- New songs, including "You're the One That I Want," "Hopelessly Devoted to You," and "Grease," were written specifically for the film; "Hopelessly Devoted to You" was added last minute as Newton-John contractually required a solo - this earned an Oscar nomination.
- Filming the "Hand Jive" scene was gruelling, with gym temperatures
- reaching 46°C, causing cast and extras to faint.

 Newton-John's black pants for the finale were broken, requiring her to be hand sewn into them.
- The final carnival scene used a real, fully operational carnival for authenticity.
- The film was a massive success, grossing around \$387 million worldwide on a \$6 million budget.
- Its soundtrack became one of the best-selling albums ever, with hits like "You're the One That I Want" and "Summer Nights" topping international charts.

Grease 2, set two years after the original, introduced new characters at Rydell High and launched Michelle Pfeiffer's breakout role as Stephanie Zinone opposite Maxwell Caulfield. Most of the original cast did not return, aside from Frenchy and Principal McGee. Featuring an all-new soundtrack with songs like "Cool Rider" and "Reproduction," and directed by first-time filmmaker Patricia Birch, the film flopped at the box office but later developed a cult following. Plans for a trilogy were abandoned after its poor reception.

THE FUTURE OF GRE

Olivia Newton-John revealed in 2003 that a new Grease seguel was being developed, though it never advanced. Paramount considered a direct-to-DVD follow-up in 2008, and in 2019 announced the prequel Summer Lovin', focused on Danny and Sandy's first summer together.



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
