LEGENDARY STORYTELLER OF THE AMERICAN WEST!

BORN MARTHA JANE CANARY IN 1852

BEST KNOWN FOR

- -her skills as a frontiers woman and sharpshooter
- -being a talented nurse
- -tobacco-spitting, beerguzzling and being foul-mouthed
- -preferring men's clothing to dresses

'Calamity Jane' is buried beside 'Wild Bill Hickok' in Mount Moriah Cemetery.

Despite reports that Hickok, who was married, had little interest in Jane, the townsfolk burried her beside him so she could spend eternity with him and they could play the ultimate joke on Hickok

Calamity Jane, a master storyteller, spun numerous ludicrous tales that added to her mythic persona.

Though many of her tales remain unverified; she claimed to have saved Captain Egan's life by riding through a hail of bullets, served as a scout for General Custer, and singlehandedly chased down horse thieves.

Jane also recounted thurnting stagecoach robberies on her own and portrayed herself as a close companion and romantic partner of Wild Bill Hickok, a relationship historians question.



'CALAMITY' NAME ORIGINS

An Old West legend claims that Jane rescued a wounded army captain during a skirmish with hostiles. The captain, grateful for her unscathed bravery, reportedly named her "Calamity Jane." However, some believe Jane fabricated this story to impress Wild Bill Hickok, the man she loved.

The other Bill in Calamity Janes' life!

In 1893, Calamity Jane began to appear in Buffalo Bill's Wild West show as a storyteller. But she was unfortunately often fired for being intoxicated on the job



In 1895, her reputation for being able to handle a horse better than most men and shoot like a cowboy allowed her to display her sharpshooting skills astride her horse

WILD BILL HICKOK



LEGENDARY GUN SLINGER OF THE AMERICAN WEST!

His nickname "Wild Bill" came from his fearless reputation as a scout

Blind in left eye!

Wild Bill had trachoma, a communicable disease that is relatively common in areas with poor hygiene

SONTE ONLY BUILD

"Buffalo Bill" first met "Wild Bill at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, when they worked for the stagecoach and wagonfreighting company together

"Wild Bill" became "Buffalo Bill's mentor during this time. In 1873 "Buffalo Bill" asked. "Wild Bill" to ioin a play he was staging



On November 13, 1873, 'Scouts of the Plains' by Hiram Robbins starring "Wild Bill," 'Buffalo Bill," and "Texas Jack" premiered in Buffalo, New York, and ran until June 1874.

This was the only "show" in which "Wild Bill" performed with "Buffalo Bill".



BEAR KNUCKUE BRAWL

In 1860, Hickok was severely injured by a bear while driving a freight team from Missouri to New Mexico. He shot at a cimnamon bear and its two cubs blocking the road, but the bullet ricocheted off the bears skull, emaging the bear. It attacked him, but he managed to fire a shot into its paw, despite the bear grabbing his arm in its mouth, he was able to fell it by slashing its throat with a knife.










The discovery of gold in the southern Black Hills in 1874 ignited one of the most significant gold rushes in American history. By 1876, miners had expanded their search to the northern Black Hills, where they stumbled upon a gulch filled with dead trees and a creek rich with gold. This serendipitous find led to the rapid establishment of Deadwood, a town that would quickly become notorious for its lawlessness and rough-and-tumble spirit.

Almost overnight, Deadwood transformed from a modest gold camp into a bustling town teeming with outlaws, gamblers, and gunslingers, all drawn by the promise of quick riches.

Deadwood is best known for being home to: Calamity Jane, Wild Bill Hickok, Al Swearengen, Seth Bullock, Sol Star, Charlie Utter & Potato Creek Johnny



DEADWOOD DISARRAY

In the 1800s, Deadwood City was a mining town that faced significant challenges, including crime and disease. While it was bustling with activity due to the Gold Rush, it was also notorious for its lawlessness, rowdy saloons, gambling halls, and brothels. The rapid influx of people and lack of proper sanitation led to poor living conditions, making the town prone to outbreaks of diseases such as smallpox and cholera.

Additionally, the town's early years were marked by violence and crime.

DEADWOOD DETAILS

-Early settlers named the city 'Deadwood' after the dead and decaying trees found in its gulch (deep V-shaped valley)

-At its height, the city had a population of 25,000

-The population was 1,156 at the 2020 census -The entire town has been designated a National

Historic Landmark District due to its well-preserved Gold Rush-era architecture.

-A devastating fire swept through Deadwood in 1879, destroying much of the town. It was quickly rebuilt, with many buildings constructed of brick and stone to prevent future fires.

In 1989. Deadwood became one of the first places outside of Nevada and Atlantic City to legalize gambling. This helped revitalize the town's economy and preserve its historic character.

Deadwood is a popular tourist destination, known for its historic sites, casinos, re-enactments of Wild West shootouts, and annual events like Deadwood Jam and Wild Bill Days.

The soundtrack was written by Sammy Fain and Paul Francis Webster, a duo who collaborated on many other successful projects.

Some of the background actors and extras in the film were actual descendants of people who lived during the Gold Rush era, adding a touch of authenticity to the cast.

During filming, Doris Day was recovering from a serious car accident that had happened a few years earlier, making her energetic performance even more impressive.

Chicago to rectify this.

This leads to Calam bringing back Katie Brown, a modest maid posing as the actress Adelaide Adams. Katie wins the hearts of Deadwood's residents, and Calamity grapples with her own feelings and identity. Amidst the chaos, Calamity falls in love with an unexpected rival, leading to humorous and heart-warming moments.

The musical, filled with lively songs, explores themes of love, identity, and self-acceptance against the colourful backdrop of frontier life.



MAURICE BUXTON AS


RATTLESNAKE/ENSEMBLE

Rep. He's excited to be back on stage in the Wild West with the amazing Tudor gang (not paid to write this, honest 6)




Alex is riding into his 14th year of musical theatre and his 11th year of being with Tudor MCS.

Her most recent roles include Holy Mary in Bad Girls and as a principal dancer in The Addams Family.


Sophie has thoroughly enjoyed rehearsing for Calamity Jane




