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Musical Synopsis

The fantasmigorical Musical Chitty Chitty Bang Bang (CCBB) is based on the 1968 film of the same name, which in turn, is based on the 1964 Novel of the same name!

Chitty Chitty Bang Bang tells the story of an eccentric inventor named Caractacus Potts who, with the help of his children Jeremy and Jemima, sets about restoring an old winning Grand Prix race car from a scrap heap. Soon, they discover the car has magical properties including the ability to float and take flight.

However, trouble ensues when the wicked Baron and Baroness Bomburst desire the magical car for themselves! After the Bomburst's lackeys; the spies (the bumbling duo, Boris and Goran) mistakenly kidnap the wrong 'Potts' family member; Grandpa Potts, with the delectable Truly Scrumptious in tow, Caractacus and company head to Vulgaria to mount a rescue attempt!

Whilst in Vulgaria, the true wickedness of the nation come to light when the Childcatcher reveals himself resulting in another kidnapping, leaving our heroes, with the assistance of the kindly Toymaker, no choice but to oust the nation of its tyrannical rulers!





 Fleming did not live to see the novel published as he suffered a heart attack on the 11 August 1964 in Canterbury, Kent and died in the early morning of the following day which was his son Caspar's twelfth birthday. The novel was published two months after his death.

When the Novel was released, Fleming had published nine James Bond books;
 The most recent of these was Thunderball.

 Dick Van Dyke became available for the lead when he turned down the role of Fagin in Oliver! He noted that he struggled with the dance numbers as he smoked on average 40 cigarettes a day!

Benny Hill (Toymaker) was initially brought in to rewrite some scenes at Dick Van Dyke's request.
Lionel Jeffries played Grandpa, despite the fact that he is 6 months younger than Dick Van Dyke.

• Baron Bomburst's castle (Neuschwanstein), was built for the "The Mad King of Bavaria". This castle is most famously

known as being the Walt Disney Pictures studio logo.

• The film story differs to the original book. The screenplay was a creation of Roald Dahl, who had recently written the screenplay for You Only Live Twice (1967). Fleming's "Chitty" was about the Potts family and their flying motorcar rescuing a French candy maker and his family from gangsters led by Joe the Monster. The story of "Vulgaria" and its

characters was entirely a Dahl creation. Dahl also came up with the character name Truly Scrumptious.

Phil Collins was one of the children storming the castle at the film's ending but was edited out because of a rather
large and unsightly bandage on his head.

• This was the first non-Disney film to feature songs by the Sherman brothers.

• Caractacus purchases the car for 'thirty bob'. A bob is slang for a shilling, 1 shillings would be equal to 0.05p, which would have totalled £1.50 in today's money. But in 1910, 30 shillings had the purchasing power of about £117 today.
